RECESS and Inclement weather

We want our students to have the opportunity to play safely outside and come inside better prepared to learn on as many days as possible, always keeping safety in mind.

A reasonable outdoor recess practice would have the objective of maximizing outdoor playtime for children while avoiding the potential for frostbite. Increasing exposure to outdoor playtime should also maximize learning potential while minimizing behavioural issues. The objective would not be for the children to avoid feeling cold. In conjunction with Environment Canada Wind Chill Chart, we will determine if a shortened (20 min.) noon hour recess is needed. This will occur when the temperature with the wind chill is -25 degrees Celsius or colder. Please ensure that your child is always dressed appropriately for the weather conditions.

Recess is supervised by staff. They always wear orange safety vests, making it easy to identify them. If at any time the staff who are outdoors feel that it is necessary to bring the students inside (weather has gotten colder, wind conditions, etc) they will call into the office and the call will be made to advise everyone to re-enter the building.

GENERAL INFORMATION YOU NEED TO KNOW!

RELIGION EDUCATION/SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

Parents are the primary educators of their children. A quality Catholic education involves a foundation of mutual respect between home, school and parish. We look forward to parental support and involvement at Holy Trinity School, as well as St. Stephen's Parish.

Our Catholic faith is continually nurtured and experienced in Religion classes, all curriculum, celebrations, and prayer. Students are actively involved in our parish through masses at the church or at the school as well as individual class tours and teaching masses with our parish priest, Fr. Nilo. There are many opportunities for parents to join in both school and classroom celebrations of our Catholic faith.

The school supports St. Stephen's Parish with sacramental preparation. Although it is the responsibility of parents to make arrangements for their children to receive any sacrament, the school will support you in doing this. If you need any assistance in helping to coordinate with the parish, please contact the school.

LOST AND FOUND

Items of value that have been found are kept in the office. Clothing and other items are then sent to the "lost and found" container. They will be put on display just before school holidays and during Parent/Teacher Conferences. All unclaimed clothing will be donated to charity; in January and June. A final donation of unclaimed clothing will also be made on the last day of school. Please be sure to encourage your child to check lost and found on a regular basis. Parents are welcome to come and check Lost and Found for any missing items.



STAFF PARKING LOT/DROPPING OFF STUDENTS - Drop and Go

As we make every effort to increase student safety in our parking lot, we will be continuing the practice of drop and go. We ask that you utilize the drop and go lane ensuring that children exit alongside the sidewalk (the driver must remain in the vehicle), to either pick up or drop off. If you need to enter the school for any reason, we ask that you use the visitor parking located on the East row of the parking lot. The drop and go was created to ensure optimal safety of the students and to make certain they are always on a sidewalk. Never permit your child to exit the car onto the road. Please come and talk to someone in the school office if you would like further clarification on this. Thank you for your help in ensuring all children are safe in our parking lot.

We thank parents who are conscious that the handicapped parking is required for some of our students and those with valid placards; please ensure that the spot is kept vacant.

We would like to remind parents and visitors that they must make an appointment to see administration

HOMEWORK

Most students should complete their school work in class, however, any assignment not completed at school may be sent home for homework. The teachers promote 10-20 minutes of reading and basic math facts practice at home every day.

BREAKFAST PROGRAM

Students who are fed a nutritious breakfast make significant improvements in learning, school attendance, behavior and self-esteem. The goal of Holy Trinity's Breakfast Program is to ensure that all children start with a healthy breakfast so they are ready to learn and succeed at school. The Breakfast Program is offered at the beginning of each school day.

POWERSCHOOL - LIVE REPORTING

We have moved to online reporting therefore, there will be no formal Report Card students will receive a certificate of placement. Parents will be required to sign in to Powerschool. Passwords will be shared with new families at the beginning of the school year. Powerschool will allow you to view your child's progress on a regular basis. We recommend you check this regularly for progress and missing assignments.
